

# AB 1550, the Climate Investments for CA Communities Act: Increased Benefits for Senate District 2

SD 2 and the surrounding area already benefit from Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund investments. AB 1550 takes the next step, *benefitting over 145,000 households in the district with incomes 80% of the state median or less.*

## SD 2 is disproportionately impacted by poverty

Based on their incomes, over 145,000 households would be eligible for benefits under AB 1550, *whether or not they live in designated Disadvantaged Communities.*

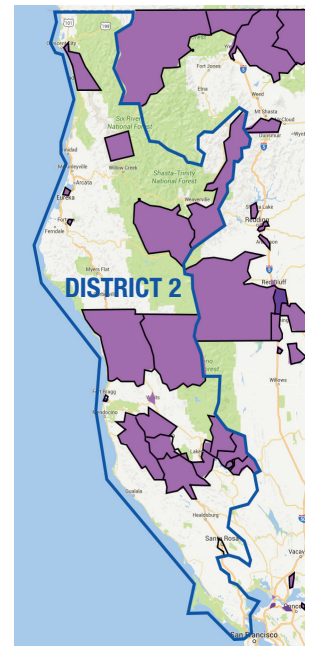
Available benefits include home weatherization, clean vehicle rebates, public transportation, affordable housing near transit, urban forestry, low-cost solar power and more.

## Sample GGRF-funded projects in SD 2

**Efficient Fixtures Direct Installation Program, Santa Rosa:** The city of Santa Rosa received \$2.5 million to reduce water use by installing 4,399 residential fixture packages and 250 commercial pre-rinse spray valves.

**Marin Agricultural Land Conservation, Marin County:** \$490,050 enabled the Marin Agricultural Land Trust to save 330 acres of ranchland near Pt. Reyes Station, protecting it as farmland forever.

**Forest Health and Legacy:** Over \$2.1 million was awarded to protect forests in the district. This includes \$800,000 to help protect 967 acres in the headwaters region of the Jacoby Creek watershed and \$518,797 to protect forests in Marin County from pests.

**Clean Vehicle Rebate Program:** About 2,700 district residents received over \$5.7 million in Clean Vehicle Rebates to replace polluting cars with plug-in hybrid and electric vehicles.



**SMART Rail Car Capacity Project, Sonoma and Marin County:** Residents of

SD 2 and the surrounding area benefited from a regional \$11 million grant to the Sonoma-Marín Area Rail Transit District to increase capacity by purchasing additional rail cars. The cars will help increase capacity during weekends, peak periods and special events.
