

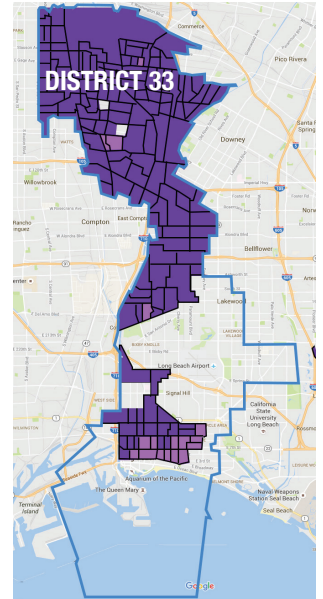
# AB 1550, the Climate Investments for CA Communities Act: Increased Benefits for Senate District 33

SD 33 and the surrounding area already benefit from Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund investments. AB 1550 takes the next step, *benefitting over 134,000 households in the district with incomes 80% of the state median or less.*

## SD 33 is disproportionately impacted by poverty

Based on their incomes, over 134,000 households – half of the district -- would be eligible for benefits under AB 1550, *whether or not they live in designated Disadvantaged Communities.*

Available benefits include home weatherization, clean vehicle rebates, public transportation, affordable housing near transit, urban forestry, low-cost solar power and more.

## SD 33 is disproportionately impacted by air pollution

Residents of the Los Angeles-Long Beach Metropolitan Area suffer from the U.S.'s highest level of ozone pollution. The region's air also ranks in the country's 10 worst for particulates, according to the American Lung Association's State of the Air 2016 Report.

## Sample GGRF-funded projects in SD 33

**Production Equipment Upgrade, Vernon:** Command Packaging received a \$3 million grant to upgrade their facility to produce bags with higher recycled content, creating 60 jobs. The facility diverts agricultural film plastic and drip tape from landfills.

**Recycling and Reuse of Carpet Fiber, Vernon:** Reliance Carpet Cushion and partners received \$1 million to increase the recovery, recycling and re-manufacturing of post-consumer carpet fiber. These fibers are used in cushions, traffic and building signs and flooring substrate.



**Route 1 Extension Project, Long Beach:** \$163,000 will allow Long Beach Transit to extend this popular bus route, increase hours of operation and improve service. In addition, district residents received \$1.45 million to purchase or lease 726 electric and plug-in hybrid vehicles through July 5, 2016
